FROM VILLAGE ROOTS TO THE 53RD CHIEF JUSTICE OF INDIA



Justice Surya Kant, born on 10 February 1962 in the village of Petwar in Hisar district of Haryana, has been appointed as the 53rd Chief Justice of India with effect from 24 November 2025. His appointment follows the retirement of Justice Bhushan Ramkrishna Gavai, the 52nd Chief Justice, whose term ends on 23 November 2025. Surya Kant grew up in a modest household; his father, Madan Gopal Sharma, was a Sanskrit teacher in rural Haryana. He completed his undergraduate studies in 1981 from Government Post Graduate College, Hisar, and earned his LL.B. in 1984 from Maharishi Dayanand University, Rohtak. Later, he obtained an LL.M. with first-class distinction from Kurukshetra University in 2011. His academic excellence and early grounding in constitutional and civil law shaped his approach toward justice and fairness in his later career. Starting his legal practice in 1984 at the district court of Hisar, he quickly earned a reputation for his deep understanding of service and constitutional law. In 1985, he moved his practice to the Punjab and Haryana High Court in Chandigarh. His abilities and

commitment were recognized early, and in July 2000, at the young age of 38, he was appointed the Advocate-General of Haryana, becoming one of the youngest to hold that position. The following year, he was designated as a Senior Advocate by the High Court. Justice Kant was elevated as a permanent judge of the Punjab and Haryana High Court on 9 January 2004. Over the years, he earned respect for his balanced judgments and progressive interpretation of law. On 5 October 2018, he became the Chief Justice of the Himachal Pradesh High Court, where he introduced several administrative reforms to improve judicial efficiency. His steady rise continued, and on 24 May 2019, he was appointed as a judge of the Supreme Court of India. On 30 October 2025, the President of India issued a formal notification appointing him as the 53rd Chief Justice of India, to assume charge on 24 November 2025. His tenure will continue until 9 February 2027. During his time at the Supreme Court, Justice Kant has been part of several landmark benches dealing with issues of constitutional importance, human rights, and

governance. He was among the judges who kept the colonial-era sedition law in abeyance pending its review, signalling a progressive and rights-oriented approach. He has also emphasized that any surveillance activity must stay within the strict bounds of law, advocating the protection of citizens' privacy and liberty.

Justice Kant's legal philosophy is deeply rooted in ensuring access to justice for all, particularly for the underprivileged and marginalized. He has repeatedly underlined the need for an empathetic judiciary that remains sensitive to the struggles of ordinary citizens. His background in service law and his work in improving legal aid mechanisms have earned him wide respect among both the Bar and Bench.

His elevation as Chief Justice is symbolically powerful, representing the rise of a person from a humble village background to the highest judicial office in the country. It highlights the inclusivity and meritocratic spirit of India's democratic institutions. As Chief Justice, Surya Kant is expected to focus on judicial reforms, reducing case pendency, and preparing the judiciary for emerging challenges such as the use of artificial intelligence in legal practice.

Justice Kant's leadership comes at a crucial time when the Indian judiciary is navigating the complexities of technology, transparency, and expanding public expectations. His journey from a rural classroom to the Supreme Court epitomizes dedication, scholarship, and integrity. As he takes over as the 53rd Chief Justice of India, the legal community and the nation will look to his tenure for both continuity and reform in upholding the ideals of justice, equality, and constitutional responsibility.

ISRO LAUNCHES INDIA'S HEAVIEST COMMUNICATION SATELLITE CMS-03



The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) marked another historic milestone, when it successfully launched its heaviest communication satellite, CMS-03, also known as GSAT-7R. The satellite was lifted into space aboard the LVM3-M5 rocket, India's most powerful launch vehicle, from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre in Sriharikota. This mission demonstrated India's growing technological confidence and expanding capabilities in space communication and defence infrastructure.

The CMS-03 satellite weighs around 4,410 kilograms, making it the heaviest satellite ever launched by an Indian rocket from Indian soil. Earlier, ISRO had launched heavier satellites such as GSAT-11, which weighed nearly 5,854 kilograms, but those were carried on foreign launchers. CMS-03's successful liftoff using an indigenous rocket marks a significant achievement for India's space program, reflecting ISRO's steady progress towards full self-reliance in heavy payload launches.

The LVM3-M5, formerly known as GSLV Mk-III, has been dubbed India's "Bahubali rocket" for its tremendous lifting capacity. This three-stage heavy-lift vehicle is capable of carrying payloads

weighing up to 4.5 tonnes into Geosynchronous Transfer Orbit (GTO) and around 10 tonnes into Low Earth Orbit (LEO). The rocket's performance in this mission reaffirmed ISRO's confidence in its design and reliability. With the successful deployment of CMS-03, India joins a select group of nations capable of launching heavy communication satellites using their own launchers.

CMS-03 is designed primarily to enhance the Indian Navy's secure communication network across land and sea. It will serve as a replacement for GSAT-7, extending coverage and improving connectivity for naval operations across the Indian Ocean region. The satellite will enable real-time data transfer, video conferencing, and surveillance communication among naval assets, bolstering India's maritime security architecture. In addition, the satellite's advanced transponders are expected to support communication for other defence services, strengthening the country's strategic and operational readiness.

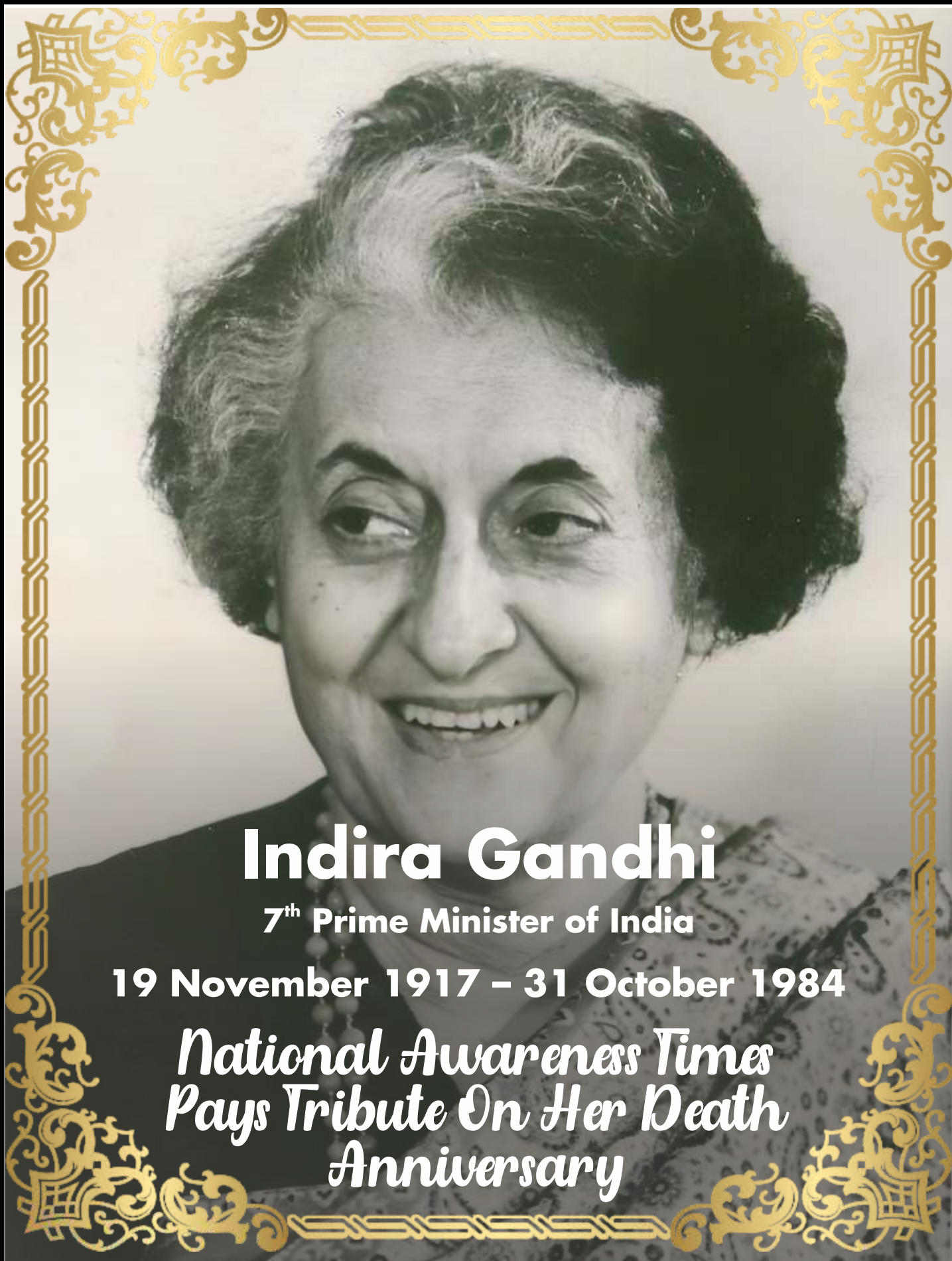
Beyond defence, CMS-03 will also contribute to India's civil communication infrastructure. Its high-bandwidth capabilities will improve data transmission speeds, emergency communication systems,

and disaster management operations. The satellite's multiple payloads are designed to operate in the UHF, S, and Ku bands, ensuring better connectivity in remote areas and enhancing India's digital outreach.

The mission's success also underscores ISRO's continuous innovation and focus on cost-effective space technology. The organisation's engineers and scientists have worked meticulously to design a satellite capable of handling extreme conditions while ensuring long operational life. ISRO Chairman Dr. S. Somanath hailed the launch as a major stride towards the country's long-term goal of technological autonomy in satellite manufacturing and launch services.

This launch comes at a time when global attention is increasingly turning toward strategic space assets and secure communications. India's decision to develop and launch CMS-03 domestically reinforces its ambition to be a leading space power. The achievement adds to ISRO's recent series of successful missions, including Chandrayaan-3, Aditya-L1, and preparations for the upcoming Gaganyaan human spaceflight mission. Each success strengthens India's position as a key player in the global space community.

In essence, the launch of CMS-03 is not just a scientific or technical accomplishment; it represents national pride, security advancement, and the steady march toward self-reliance in space technology. By launching the heaviest communication satellite from its own soil, ISRO has showcased India's ability to independently develop and deploy complex space systems. As CMS-03 begins its mission in orbit, it stands as a symbol of India's growing capability, determination, and vision for a future powered by indigenous innovation and space-based infrastructure.



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A HISTORIC FIRST: KERALA DECLARES END TO EXTREME POVERTY



Kerala has created history by becoming the first Indian state to eradicate extreme poverty. The announcement was made by Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan on during the state's formation day celebrations. This remarkable achievement marks a new chapter in India's social development journey and highlights Kerala's long-standing commitment to inclusive welfare and human dignity.

The initiative to eliminate extreme poverty began in 2021 with the launch of the Extreme Poverty Eradication Project (EPEP). The state government identified over 64,000 families living in extreme deprivation, characterized not only by low income but also by the lack of access to basic needs such as housing, healthcare, food security, education, and social welfare schemes. What made the initiative distinct was its human-centered approach. Instead of relying on broad statistical measures, the government created individual micro-plans for each identified family, ensuring that interventions addressed their specific needs.

Under the program, thousands of new houses were built and repaired, families without land were

provided plots, and food security was ensured for those struggling to meet daily needs. Health support reached tens of thousands of individuals, while social security measures, including pensions and ration cards, were extended to every eligible person. The initiative was implemented in close coordination with local self-government bodies, Kudumbashree groups, and community volunteers, who played an essential role in verifying data, monitoring progress, and offering continued support.

Kerala's achievement did not come overnight. The state has long been recognized for its strong social infrastructure, high literacy rate, effective healthcare system, and decentralised governance model. Over the decades, consistent investments in education, land reforms, and public health created a foundation for social equity. The success of the poverty eradication mission is a direct result of these cumulative efforts, combined with focused political will and grassroots participation.

According to official data, the state's multidimensional poverty index was already among the lowest in the country. However, Kerala aimed to go beyond

numbers by addressing the last pockets of extreme deprivation. The government's focus was on ensuring that every family had a dignified standard of living. This included eliminating hunger, providing shelter, ensuring medical care, and securing livelihood opportunities. The mission's goal was not just to raise incomes but to restore dignity and opportunity for those at the margins of society.

The declaration of "zero extreme poverty" is a landmark social milestone, but it has also sparked debate. Critics have questioned the accuracy of the data and the definition of "extreme poverty." Opposition leaders have demanded transparency in the survey methods and follow-up plans to ensure that those lifted out of poverty do not relapse. Nonetheless, even skeptics have acknowledged the scale and seriousness of Kerala's effort in addressing one of the most complex human challenges.

Kerala's model offers valuable lessons for other Indian states. Its success demonstrates the power of local governance, community participation, and sustained investment in human development. By combining welfare measures with personalized interventions, the state has set a new benchmark for targeted poverty elimination.

Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan described the achievement as the beginning of a new journey rather than the end of one. The state now aims to strengthen resilience among its most vulnerable citizens and ensure that no family ever falls back into poverty. Kerala's declaration stands as a symbol of hope and determination, showing that with political commitment, inclusive planning, and people's participation, even the most ambitious social goals can be achieved.
