

INDIA'S EMERGENCE AS THE WORLD'S FOURTH LARGEST ECONOMY

India's emergence as the world's fourth largest economy marks a defining moment in its modern history and reflects the steady transformation of a nation that has moved from economic vulnerability to global prominence. BIHAR CM ANNOUNCES HOME HEALTH SERVICES FOR SENIOR CITIZENS



The Bihar Chief Minister's announcement of home health services for senior citizens marks an important step toward strengthening healthcare delivery for the elderly in the state. As Bihar's population ages and the number of elderly citizens increases, access to timely and affordable healthcare has become a major concern. Many senior citizens face difficulties in travelling to hospitals due to age related health issues, mobility limitations, or lack of family support. The new initiative aims to address these challenges by bringing essential medical services directly to their homes. Under the proposed home health service programme, senior citizens will be able to receive basic medical care, regular health check ups, and follow up services without leaving their residences. The scheme is designed to support elderly individuals who suffer from chronic illnesses such as diabetes, hypertension, heart disease, and respiratory problems, which require continuous monitoring and care. By ensuring doorstep medical assistance, the government hopes to reduce hospital overcrowding and improve the overall quality of life for older citizens. The Chief Minister emphasised that caring for senior citizens is both a

social responsibility and a moral duty. Many elderly people, especially those living alone or in rural areas, struggle to access healthcare facilities due to distance, financial constraints, or physical weakness. Home based health services will help bridge this gap and ensure that senior citizens receive timely medical attention before their conditions worsen. This preventive approach can significantly reduce medical emergencies and hospital admissions.

The home health services are expected to include regular visits by trained healthcare professionals such as nurses, paramedical staff, and community health workers. These professionals will conduct routine health assessments, monitor vital signs, provide basic treatment, assist with medication management, and offer guidance on nutrition and lifestyle. In some cases, telemedicine support may also be used to connect patients with doctors for consultation and advice.

This initiative is particularly significant for Bihar, where a large section of the population lives in rural and semi urban areas. For elderly residents in villages, accessing hospitals often involves long travel times and additional

expenses. Home health services can reduce these burdens and ensure that healthcare reaches even the most vulnerable sections of society. The scheme is also expected to complement existing public health programmes and strengthen primary healthcare delivery at the grassroots level. The announcement has been widely welcomed by social welfare groups and healthcare experts, who see it as a progressive move toward inclusive healthcare. They believe that home based care not only improves physical health outcomes but also supports mental and emotional well being. Regular interaction with healthcare workers can reduce feelings of isolation and neglect among senior citizens, which are common issues faced by the elderly.

However, the success of the programme will depend on effective implementation. Adequate staffing, proper training, timely funding, and strong monitoring mechanisms will be essential to ensure quality services. Coordination between health departments, local administration, and community institutions will play a key role in reaching eligible beneficiaries. Public awareness campaigns will also be necessary so that senior citizens and their families are informed about how to access the services. The Bihar government's decision to introduce home health services for senior citizens reflects a growing recognition of the unique healthcare needs of an ageing population. If implemented efficiently, the initiative has the potential to become a model for other states seeking to improve elder care. By prioritising dignity, accessibility, and preventive healthcare, the programme represents a meaningful step toward building a more compassionate and responsive health system for Bihar's senior citizens.

UTTARAKHAND REIGNITES DEMANDS FOR JUSTICE IN ANKITA BHANDARI CASE



The Ankita Bhandari case continues to resonate deeply across Uttarakhand, reflecting public anger, grief, and an ongoing demand for justice even years after the young woman's tragic death. Ankita, a 19 year old receptionist working at a private resort near Rishikesh, was reported missing in September 2022. A few days later, her body was recovered from a canal, sending shockwaves across the state and triggering widespread protests. The case quickly became a symbol of concerns related to women's safety, political influence, and accountability in the justice system.

Investigations revealed that Ankita was allegedly murdered after resisting pressure linked to unethical demands made at her workplace. The arrest of the resort owner and his associates initially brought some relief to the public, as the case appeared to move swiftly through the legal process. A special investigation team was formed, and the accused were later convicted and sentenced, marking a significant development in the case. However, despite the court verdict, public dissatisfaction did not subside completely.


Many citizens and activists believe that the case involves deeper layers that have not been fully exposed. Allegations of the involvement of influential individuals have continued to surface from time to time, keeping the issue alive in public discourse. These claims have reignited protests across various districts of Uttarakhand, with demonstrators demanding a more comprehensive investigation and accountability beyond those already convicted.

Recent developments and statements from different quarters have once again brought the case into the spotlight. Protesters, including women's groups and youth organisations, have taken to the streets demanding transparency and fairness. They argue that justice should not only be done but should also be seen to be done, especially in cases involving vulnerable individuals and alleged abuse of power. Slogans calling for protection of women and strict punishment for all responsible parties have echoed across the state.

The victim's family has remained steadfast in its pursuit of justice. Ankita's parents have repeatedly

expressed their pain and disappointment, stating that while the punishment of the accused is important, uncovering the complete truth is equally necessary. They have appealed to authorities to ensure that no one involved, directly or indirectly, is shielded due to political or social influence. Their determination has drawn widespread public sympathy and support.

The case has also intensified political debate in Uttarakhand. Opposition parties have accused the government of failing to ensure full transparency, while the ruling administration has maintained that the investigation and trial were conducted lawfully and without interference. Senior officials have assured the public that the state remains committed to justice and is open to further inquiry if new evidence emerges. Beyond legal and political dimensions, the Ankita Bhandari case has sparked broader conversations about workplace safety, exploitation, and the vulnerability of young women employed in the hospitality sector. Civil society groups have called for stricter regulation of private resorts, better grievance mechanisms for employees, and stronger enforcement of laws to prevent exploitation. As time passes, the Ankita Bhandari case remains a powerful reminder of the need for systemic reform and societal vigilance. While legal proceedings have delivered punishment, the continued public reaction shows that trust in institutions depends on transparency, accountability, and empathy. The case has left a lasting impact on Uttarakhand's social and political landscape, reinforcing the collective demand that justice.

STRONG EARTHQUAKE JOLTS JAPAN'S CHUGOKU REGION, TRIGGERS EMERGENCY CHECKS



A strong earthquake struck Japan's Chugoku region on January 6, 2026, causing intense shaking across western parts of the country and prompting emergency inspections and temporary disruptions. The quake, measuring 6.2 in magnitude, occurred in Shimane Prefecture and was felt widely in surrounding areas, including parts of Hiroshima, Okayama, and Tottori. While no tsunami warning was issued, the tremor raised concerns due to its strength and shallow depth, which amplified surface level shaking. Residents in several cities reported violent tremors that made it difficult to stand, with household items falling from shelves and furniture shifting suddenly. Many people rushed outdoors as buildings shook, while local authorities activated disaster response protocols to assess potential damage. The Japan Meteorological Agency classified the shaking intensity as strong, warning that additional aftershocks could follow in the coming days.

Japan is located along the Pacific Ring of Fire, one of the most seismically active zones in the world, and experiences frequent earthquakes of varying magnitudes.

However, quakes above magnitude six are considered significant and often disrupt daily life, even when they do not cause widespread destruction. The January 6 earthquake served as a reminder of the country's constant exposure to seismic risk and the importance of preparedness.

Transportation services in the affected region were temporarily halted as a precautionary measure. High speed train services on certain routes were suspended to allow safety inspections of tracks, bridges, and tunnels. Local rail and road services also experienced brief interruptions, though most operations gradually resumed once authorities confirmed there was no structural damage. Such precautionary suspensions are standard practice in Japan following strong seismic activity.

Concerns were also raised about critical infrastructure, particularly nuclear facilities located in western Japan. Officials confirmed that nuclear power stations in and around the region were operating normally and that no abnormalities were detected. Safety checks were conducted immediately after the quake, and authorities reassured the public that all necessary

safeguards were in place. This reassurance was crucial given Japan's past experience with nuclear emergencies triggered by natural disasters.

Emergency services and local governments carried out rapid assessments of residential areas, public buildings, and key facilities. While there were reports of minor damage, such as cracked walls and fallen objects, no large scale destruction or loss of life was immediately reported. Hospitals and emergency shelters were placed on alert, but there was no need for mass evacuations.

Experts noted that Japan's strict building codes and disaster preparedness systems played a vital role in limiting the impact of the earthquake. Structures are designed to withstand strong shaking, and regular disaster drills ensure that citizens know how to respond during emergencies. Public awareness campaigns and early warning systems have significantly reduced casualties in recent decades, even during powerful earthquakes. Authorities urged residents to remain cautious in the days following the quake, as aftershocks can sometimes be strong enough to cause additional damage. People were advised to secure loose items, stay informed through official channels, and keep emergency supplies ready. The government also emphasized the importance of community cooperation and calm during such events. The earthquake in the Chugoku region once again highlighted Japan's vulnerability to natural disasters and the constant need for vigilance. Although the impact was limited, the incident reinforced the value of preparedness, resilient infrastructure, and swift response mechanisms. As seismic activity continues to shape life in Japan, the ability to minimise damage and protect lives remains a central national priority.

SHRADDHA KAPOOR TO START NAAGIN SHOOT IN APRIL AFTER EETHA WRAPS



Bollywood actor Shraddha Kapoor is gearing up for a packed and varied year in her film career, with back-to-back projects lined up for 2026. After completing work on the biographical drama *Eetha*, she is set to begin shooting the much-anticipated fantasy film *Naagin* in April.

Kapoor is currently in the final phase of filming *Eetha*, directed by Laxman Utekar, in which she portrays legendary Tamasha and Lavani performer Vithabai Narayangaonkar. The role has demanded intense physical preparation and emotional depth, with the actress undergoing months of training.

A production source told *Mid-Day*: “Shraddha has been deeply invested in *Eetha*. The role is physically gruelling and emotionally intense, but she is keen to finish the film within the schedule. The makers are confident of wrapping by March.”

The shoot experienced a brief pause after Kapoor sustained an injury during a dance sequence, but insiders say this did not significantly derail the schedule.

Immediately after completing *Eetha*, Kapoor will switch genres and begin work on *Naagin*, a high-concept fantasy film slated to go on floors in April 2026. According to the report, the project has been in development for some time, with efforts focused on finalising visual design and casting ahead of principal photography.

The report quoted a production insider saying: “*Naagin* has been in development for a long time, and the team wanted to get everything right — from the VFX design to the casting. With Shraddha locked in, the rest of the cast has fallen into place. The plan is to start shooting by April.”

The film is expected to explore supernatural and mythological themes, marking a distinct shift from Kapoor’s recent performance-driven role in *Eetha*.

THE KERALA STORY SEQUEL LOCKS FEBRUARY 27, 2026 THEATRICAL RELEASE; DETAILS INSIDE



Filmmaker Vipul Amrutlal Shah and Sunshine Pictures Limited have officially announced the release date of their upcoming film *Beyond The Kerala Story*, which will arrive in cinemas on February 27, 2026. The film serves as the second chapter in the *The Kerala Story* franchise and is positioned as a continuation that expands its scope and narrative depth.

A motion poster released by the makers confirmed the date and offered an early insight into the film’s tone. The text on the poster reads:

“They said it was just a story. They tried to silence it. They tried to discredit it. But the truth didn’t stop. Because some stories don’t end. This time, it goes deeper. This time, it hurts more.”

According to the makers, *Beyond The Kerala Story* revisits real-life

accounts, focusing on voices of victims and stories that have often remained unheard. The film introduces fresh talent as its leading women, with performances described as organic and rooted in lived realities from across different regions of India.

Unlike its predecessor, which largely centred on events in Kerala, the upcoming film widens its lens to include true stories from across Bharat, aiming to present a broader perspective while retaining its grounded, documentary-style approach to storytelling.

The Kerala Story, released in 2023, emerged as one of the most discussed films of the year, generating nationwide debate. The film went on to receive the National Award for Best Direction and Best Cinematography, further cementing its place in contemporary Hindi cinema.


