

# SHAH SON OF INDIA

**A**mit Shah, the Union Home Minister of India, paid obeisance at Gurudwara Gobind Dham in the Thaltej area of Ahmedabad, Gujarat, in a moment that reflected faith, humility, and the spirit of India's pluralistic traditions. ## BLINKIT, ZEPTO, ZOMATO AND SWIGGY REMOVE THE 10 MINUTE DELIVERY PROMISE



India's quick commerce industry has entered a new phase as leading platforms Blinkit, Zepto, Zomato and Swiggy have removed the widely promoted 10 minute delivery claim from their apps and marketing. The decision marks a significant shift in how these companies present their services and reflects growing concerns around rider safety, work pressure and sustainable business practices in the gig economy.

For the past few years, ultra fast delivery had become the defining feature of quick commerce in India. Companies competed aggressively by promising groceries, food and daily essentials within just 10 minutes. This promise reshaped consumer behaviour, especially in urban areas, where instant delivery became an expectation rather than a luxury. However, behind this speed driven model, concerns were steadily building about the impact on delivery partners who were under constant pressure to meet tight timelines.

The removal of the 10 minute delivery promise follows growing scrutiny over the working conditions of gig workers. Delivery partners often reported that fixed and highly visible time commitments increased stress and encouraged risky behaviour on the

roads. The fear of penalties, lower ratings or reduced incentives pushed many riders to rush through traffic, sometimes at the cost of their own safety and that of others. By dropping the explicit 10 minute claim, platforms aim to reduce this psychological pressure and signal a move towards safer delivery practices.

Blinkit was among the first companies to change its messaging, quietly replacing the speed focused tagline with broader descriptions of convenience and product range. Zepto and Swiggy soon followed, updating their apps and communication to remove direct references to guaranteed 10 minute delivery. Zomato, which operates across food delivery and quick commerce, has also aligned with this approach. While deliveries may still arrive very quickly in many cases, the companies are no longer publicly committing to a rigid time frame.

Importantly, this change does not mean that quick commerce is slowing down. The underlying infrastructure of dark stores, data driven logistics and dense delivery networks remains intact. In many urban neighbourhoods, customers may continue to receive orders in 10 to 15 minutes, depending on availability and distance. The key

difference is that speed is no longer being marketed as a fixed promise but as a possible outcome based on efficiency and proximity. The move has sparked mixed reactions among consumers. Some users feel that the 10 minute promise was more of a marketing gimmick and that reliability matters more than exact timing. Others worry that delivery times may gradually increase. However, a large section of the public has welcomed the change, viewing it as a step towards more humane working conditions for delivery partners.

For gig workers, the removal of the 10 minute label is seen as a positive development. While challenges around pay, job security and benefits still remain, reducing the emphasis on extreme speed can help ease daily stress. It may also encourage platforms to focus on better planning, fair incentives and realistic delivery expectations rather than constant urgency. From an industry perspective, this shift suggests a maturing of India's quick commerce sector. After a phase of aggressive growth and bold claims, companies are now being nudged towards more responsible and sustainable models. Balancing customer convenience with worker welfare is becoming a central issue, and branding changes reflect this evolving priority.

In the long run, the success of quick commerce will depend not just on how fast an order arrives, but on how safely and fairly the system operates. By moving away from the 10 minute delivery promise, Blinkit, Zepto, Zomato and Swiggy appear to be acknowledging that speed alone cannot define the future of the industry.

## INSPIRED BY HIS MOTHER, KHAN SIR OPENS A NEW HOSPITAL IN PATNA

## IRANIAN STATE TV ISSUES SHARP WARNING TO DONALD TRUMP



Iranian state television recently issued a sharp warning aimed at former US President Donald Trump, declaring that he would not be “missed” if targeted, a statement that has once again escalated tensions between Tehran and Washington. The remarks, broadcast on Iranian TV, quickly drew international attention and added to the already strained relationship between Iran and the United States, which has remained volatile for years due to sanctions, military standoffs, and unresolved diplomatic disputes. The statement is widely seen as linked to long standing Iranian anger over the killing of General Qassem Soleimani in January 2020. Soleimani, a top Iranian military commander and head of the Quds Force, was killed in a US drone strike near Baghdad airport during Donald Trump’s presidency. Iran has repeatedly vowed revenge for his death, and references to retaliation have surfaced regularly in speeches, media broadcasts, and official statements since then. The recent comment by Iranian television appears to revive that narrative, using provocative language to underline unresolved grievances. Iranian officials and state affiliated media often use strong rhetoric as

part of psychological and political messaging. Such statements are typically aimed at both domestic and international audiences. Domestically, they reinforce the image of resistance against the United States and appeal to nationalist sentiment. Internationally, they serve as a reminder that Iran considers the Soleimani killing an open wound and a matter of justice rather than a closed chapter. From the US perspective, such comments are viewed as threats and contribute to concerns over the safety of American political figures and interests. US authorities have previously acknowledged credible threats against former and current officials linked to the decision to authorize the strike on Soleimani. Security around Trump and other senior figures has remained tight, reflecting the seriousness with which Washington treats these warnings, regardless of whether they are symbolic or operational. The timing of the statement is also notable. Tensions in the Middle East have been heightened by conflicts involving Iran aligned groups, the war in Gaza, instability in the Red Sea, and ongoing clashes involving US forces and regional militias. In this environment, even rhetorical threats carry weight, as miscalculations could quickly

escalate into broader confrontations. Iranian media statements, therefore, are closely monitored by diplomats and security agencies around the world.

Iran has consistently denied seeking direct war with the United States, while simultaneously emphasizing its right to respond to what it sees as acts of aggression. This dual approach allows Tehran to project strength without openly committing to direct military action. Statements aired on state television often operate within this grey zone, stopping short of official policy declarations while still conveying a message of deterrence and defiance.

International reactions to the broadcast have ranged from condemnation to cautious concern. Many observers see such rhetoric as unhelpful at a time when diplomatic channels, though limited, remain important to prevent further escalation. Others argue that the language reflects deep rooted mistrust that has accumulated over decades and cannot be easily softened without meaningful political change on both sides. For Donald Trump, who remains a central figure in American politics, the statement adds another layer to his already complex relationship with Iran. His presidency was marked by the withdrawal from the Iran nuclear deal and the adoption of a maximum pressure policy, actions that reshaped US Iran relations and hardened positions on both sides. In conclusion, the Iranian TV statement warning that Trump would not be missed underscores how past actions continue to shape present tensions. While largely rhetorical, such remarks highlight unresolved conflicts, deep grievances, and the fragile nature of stability in the region. As long as these issues remain unaddressed, strong words and symbolic threats are likely to persist, keeping relations between Iran and the United States on edge.

## No delay for Sanjay Leela Bhansali's Love & War; film STILL on track for 2026 release



Speculation surrounding a possible delay in the release of Sanjay Leela Bhansali's *Love & War* has been addressed, with sources close to the film firmly denying reports that the project has been postponed to 2027.

There was a report earlier in the day claiming that the much-anticipated film—starring Ranbir Kapoor, Alia Bhatt and Vicky Kaushal—had been pushed back by a year due to extended shooting schedules. According to that report, Bhansali was expected to wrap the film only by mid-2026, prompting assumptions of a 2027 theatrical release.

However, these claims have now been refuted. A source close to

the film clarified, "The film is very much set to release in 2026. Sanjay Leela Bhansali has just completed shooting a song track and the major sequences for the film have already been shot."

The clarification indicates that while production is ongoing, the project has not deviated from its planned release window. The source further suggested that progress on key portions of the film has been substantial, countering speculation that delays in filming would impact its timeline.

*Love & War* marks Bhansali's first collaboration with Ranbir Kapoor and Vicky Kaushal, while reuniting him with Alia Bhatt after *Gangubai Kathiawadi*. While reports of scheduling shifts are not uncommon for films of this scale, the latest statement makes it clear that *Love & War* is still aiming for a 2026 release, as originally planned. As of now, the makers have not announced an exact release date, but sources maintain that the film's timeline remains unchanged.

## Virat Kohli and Anushka Sharma buy land parcels worth Rs 38 crores in Alibag



Indian cricketer Virat Kohli and actor Anushka Sharma have reportedly invested in prime real estate near Mumbai by purchasing land parcels worth Rs 38 crores in Alibag, Maharashtra. According to a report by PTI, the couple has bought approximately 21,000 square metres of land in the coastal town, further expanding their growing real estate portfolio.




